

Creative Experiential Learning in Abruzzo 2014-2015 "Learning is experience, everything else is just information" - Albert Einstein

Seminar Summary:

The seminar serves as an Introduction for Creative Experiential Learning through storytelling, theater and participatory art. Participants will learn how experience can inspire learning and how theater games, and creative participatory art exercises can create a more effective (and fun) learning experience in the classroom and out of the classroom (non-formal education and e-learning). The Seminar is for both teachers, non formal educators, students, and other interested in innovative use of Theater and Participatory Art in varied educational contexts.

Training place:

Nuova Arcadia School has its headquarters in Casalbordino, a friendly town on the Adriatic sea, in Abruzzo region, in the center of Italy. The School has operational structures with offices and classrooms equipped with specific equipment: didactic materials, libraries, cinema room and internet wi-fi. Casalbordino preserved the atmosphere of an Italian old town, and it is situated in a very good position: it is near the sea but, in the same time, quite close to the Appennini mountains, 45 minutes from Pescara international airport and less then 3 hours from Rome.

Seminar trainers:

Uri Noy Meir, a participatory arts facilitator, and has led workshops and trainings for activists, educators, social workers and artists in Nepal, India, Northern Ireland, the Us, Israel-Palestine, Estonia, Croatia, Holland, Georgia and Italy. Uri offers workshops that integrate T.O. practices with participatory photography. He is also involved in developing networks of Theater of the Oppressed practitioners all over the world using the internet as a platform for sharing meaningful and transformative work all around the globe.

Ilaria Olimpico is a storyteller and trainer/educator. She has been facilitating workshops and seminars that dealt with issues of gender and inter-culture, applying techniques of Theater of the Oppressed and Narrative Circle, inspiring reflection on personal and social reality. She has worked with children, young people and adults. She is a talented storyteller/writer (with many published short stories on the website orientexpress.na.it and TheAlbero blog)

Other trainers would include local expert guides in day tours.

HOW TO APPLY FOR ERASMUS PLUS: KEY ACTION 1 - MOBILITY OF INDIVIDUAL

- 1) Select one of Creative Experiential Learning in Abruzzo seminars Inform your school or college that you would like to attend a course abroad with Erasmus+funding. (INDIVIDUAL TEACHERS CANNOT APPLY FOR FUNDING.)
- 2) Speak to your headteacher/director/principal/manager and your colleagues if they are interested in attending courses and in which course dates they are interested to apply for. The Application Form is filled by the school/organization, a single teacher or group of teachers that are competent to do that could make it. I shall assist to our co-partners when it is needed.
- 3) Pre-register through the online form:

- 4)Then we will send you an e-mail to confirm your registration and you will receive a <u>Mandate agreement</u> to sign and will indicate that a place will be reserved for your school/organization on the course until you let us know whether or not you can definitely attend approved or not. (it is also should be sent with final application)
- 6) A representative of your school/organization will need to:
- a) Register your school (or other organization) in the Participant Portal in order to obtain a Personal Identification Code (PIC) number for your school. See page 191 of the Erasmus+Programme Guide: www.erasmusplus.org.uk/sites/default/files/erasmus-plus-programme-guide-en.pdf

b) By 17 March 2014 submit an online application. (ask us for the forms if you don't find)

Your school can use the information about the course objectives and content and other tips we include in a file we send to you when you pre- register to complete the application.

Your school (or organization) will need to include in the application a European Development Plan for the school/organization (which must focus on the subject/s of the chosen course/s).

There needs to be a clear link between your (& your colleagues') attendance at a course abroad and your school's European Development Plan.

It is also important to indicate that the teaching ideas and materials acquired on the course will not only be used to enhance your own lessons, but will also be disseminated to your colleagues at a workshop which you will conduct after your course, so that a large number of students will benefit

Funding Rules (pages 58-59 of the Erasmus+ Programme Guide) indicate maximum allowances per person:

70 Euro per day.
Course fees Maximum 700 Euro.

Individual support (subsistence ie

accommodation & meals) 80-160 Euro per day

Organisational support 350 Euro

eg.500-1999 km: 275

Travel (varies according to travel distance) Euro

The combined funding for course fee and accommodation & meals should be sufficient for all ISP courses.
